RYE CONSERVATION COMMISSION Natural Resource Inventory Work Shop Tuesday, April 21, 2020 1:00 p.m. – Via ZOOM

I. Call to Order

Chair McFarland called the work session to order at 1:05 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

II. Right to Know Law during State of Emergency

Statement by Chair McFarland:

III. Approval of Minutes of April 14, 2020

The following correction was noted:

• Page 5, 4th paragraph from the bottom, 1st sentence should read: Chair McFarland <u>commented</u> that the Town of Hampton has a chapter like this in their master plan.

Motion passed.

IV. NRI – Formulate Purpose and Goals – based on Master Plan and other NRI's

Chair McFarland presented an outline she drafted to start work on the purpose and goals for the NRI.

<u>NRI draft:</u>

- \circ The members agreed to have the purpose and goals listed separately. It was suggested that the overall goals should be stated in the beginning.
- All members agreed that they liked the format of Epping's purpose with bullet points being used. They agreed the purpose and goals should be simple to read.
- Chair McFarland liked Campton's intent; "working document to guide planning and policy". It was agreed it should be clear that this is a working document and is always changing.
- \circ The goals should also include the climate element and coastal references.
- The members agreed to combine Epping's and Washington's goals. Some favored goals:
 - ✤ To protect the Town's water quality, wetlands and aquifers
 - $\clubsuit \ To \ maintain \ recreational \ opportunities \ through \ protection \ and \ connection$
 - ✤ To protect the natural ability of the landscape to withstand flooding

It was agreed the members can edit and add their thoughts on goals to the draft online.

V. Review Master Plan Chapter 7 Natural Resources

The Commission reviewed Chapter 7 Natural Resources of the Rye Master Plan.

Comments:

- The most recent data is 2015. Should get updated data for the NRI if possible.
- Master Plan Visioning Process (7.2) Lists objectives and issues relative to the area. These should be reviewed to determine how much of this should be incorporated into the NRI.

Some favored issues/objectives:

- Beaches/Waterfront keep beaches clean, stabilizing shorelines, controlling invasive species, control flooding from climate change, minimize impacts
- The members agreed that they like other communities' NRI's that included population change, which is not included in Chapter 7 of Rye's Master Plan. Some information and benchmarks can be taken from the 'Land Use' Chapter.
- Other information to be considered for NRI: Water Resource Maps; Forest Management Plan; and Rand Parcel Forest Management Plan
- Other departments in town may have resources and information that may be relevant to the NRI. (This may be organized and coordinated by a consultant)
- The members agreed that they liked the 'Next Steps' in Chapter 7, as it covers things the Conservation Commission is already doing.

It was agreed to use the Master Plan as a reference document and work through it with the consultant.

VI. Next Steps

- Member Truslow agreed to compile a list of relevant reference documents that have been created by the Conservation Commission.
- Chair McFarland has reached out to the Isles of Shoals and is still waiting to hear back.
- Chair McFarland will email the RFP to the group to review. She will also follow up with the Town Administrator on best practices on the RFP process.
- Chair McFarland will reach out to Amanda Stone and Lisa Wise to see if they can meet with the group in two weeks. (May 5th)
- Members to give suggestions and edits to the online document for next meeting.

Vice-Chair King noted that volunteers are welcome at the Goss Farm to help weed the blueberries. There are other ongoing projects at the farm that the Commission needs help with.

There was some discussion about possibly starting a sign-up list through 'Sign-up Genie' so people will still be able to practice social distancing.
