

The Recreation Department of the Town of Rye operates under the direction of the Rye Recreation Commission (RRC) founded in 1964. The RRC has jurisdiction under RSA Title III, Chapter 35-B, Public Recreation and Parks.

The RRC is responsible for land and facilities reserved for recreational use and providing leisuretime services to the residents of Rye.

The RRC develops and enforces policies and procedures as well as plays a strong management role within the Recreation Department.

The RRC is comprised of an active group of seven volunteer citizens who meet monthly to conduct business.

Each RRC meeting is open to the public and interested persons are welcome to attend and encouraged to contribute thoughts and idea toward making Rye a more vibrant community.

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INTRODUCTION

On behalf of the Rye Recreation Commission (RRC), the Town of Rye hired Ironwood Design Group to update the master plan for the recreation facility located at 55 Recreation Road.

The project entailed a three part process to create the final updated master plan.

Conduct an existing conditions analysis of the 55 Recreation Road property.

Work with the RCC and Recreation Director to understand the Town's recreation programming.

Create a comprehensive updated master site plan for the property that considers the existing conditions analysis, the RRC's public outreach and meetings with Town staff.

Following meetings with Town committees and staff, and conducting an online public survey, the RRC provided a list of desires for the master plan:

- Recreation Department office and meeting space
- Covered space for inclement weather and for shade
- Pickle ball/ tennis courts possibly with/without basketball
- Pump track
- Picnic pavilion
- Revenue generation and use for inclement weather (camp)
- Free standing restroom building option
- Facility wide universal accessibility
- Picnic / eating / socializing area supportive of concessions
- Expand recreation offerings
- Add trails and greater connectivity on site and community nodes
- Additional 50 parking spaces (goal 140 total)





The 55 Recreation Road recreation facility is the location of heavily used athletic fields and recreation assets.

Upon arrival at Recreation Road, to the left there is a wetland and pond. On the right hand side of the access road is the little league field. The fenced little league field facility includes a bullpen area, spectator stands, the Sexton announcement building (painted gray), and a standalone concession building (painted green) with wooded picnic area. Also found in this upper field area is a half-sized basketball court, a recreation building with bathrooms (the summer camp building/converted historic pavilion painted white), a recreation staff office trailer (painted white), and a children's playground with benches.

Pedestrian infrastructure internal to the property is virtually nonexistent. Most of the site does not meet ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) accessibility requirements.

There is minimal lighting on site, and thus the facility is not used after dark. At high use times, traffic congestion occurs. These conditions can create safety concerns due to poor pedestrian and vehicular separation or delineation.

The numerous tree roots create unsafe walking conditions through the picnic area and to bathrooms and the staff office building. While there is a ramp to provide ADA access to the office building and recreation building bathrooms, there is no safe or ADA accessible path to these locations.

The playground adjacent to the staff office building is in good condition; it lacks a perimeter safety fence. It does not meet ADA requirements and will not meet 2024 NH state playground accessibility requirements.

A basketball court behind the little league field is adjacent to a poorly drained vegetated area; the court is in fair-poor condition and doesn't appear well-used.

The Recreation Road facility lacks wayfinding and there is little signage. The facility kiosk did not display a facility map.

Upon arrival in the main paved parking lot, there is a recreation kiosk and hydrant. Here at the Ralph Morange athletic field (lower field), there is a partially fenced multi-use ball field with safety backstop and emergency vehicular access is limited; there are older benches on the sidelines for athletes. The recreation department garage building (painted gray) is located here adjacent to the lower field and paved parking lot. The garage building is multi-use as it also affords equipment storage and a concession stand. There are no bathrooms at the lower field location.

Behind the garage is a gravel parking lot and trail head where residents access popular trails found on an adjacent open space parcel.

The stairways from the paved parking lot to lower field are in dangerous condition and blocked off. Desire line foot paths had developed in the absence of working stairs; there is no ADA accessible path from handicapped parking to the lower field.

Paved parking lot asphalt is in fair condition; it could be reconfigured to optimize capacity.


Vegetation is overgrown on the edges of turfed areas. Generally, the turf on the two ball fields appeared in good condition, although this was observed during a historically rainy spring and summer. Areas of poorly drained soils are present with minimal drainage infrastructure. Depending on seasonal conditions, athletic field turf recovery time may be long.





Following examination of the project site and the programming requests made by the RRC, an updated master site plan was developed.

The lower athletic field could be expanded to provide additional playing field areas: conceptual design 3 depicts a possible field layout with expansion towards the northern property boundary.

In the preferred final master site plan design, the lower athletic field remains unexpanded, but the arrangement enhances possible simultaneous use of three youth-sized soccer fileds (2, 7X7 and 1, U11/U12); the plan also shows the existing ball field, and a new softball field and ball kicking wall.

The back lot parking and access to the walking trails remain in place but with desired improvements—a paved parking area and a trail head map kiosk. A new bicycle pump track is intended for a location adjacent to the trail head behind an expanded recreation garage building complex.

The main parking lot is shown expanded and reconfigured to provide 120 vehicle parking spots (not including access road parking); adjacent to the expanded parking areas are four stormwater treatment rain gardens (total 2,000 sf), strategically located to protect the wetlands and conservation area pond from run off. A new ecology walking trail is provided around the conservation area and pond.

The recreation garage multipurpose building is expanded with two additions: a recreation staff office building addition (675 sf) with restrooms and a new gym flex space 60' x 100' that can be programmed for indoor tennis, pickle ball, and basketball.

Planned in the upper field area adjacent to the little league field are:

- New shade pavilion 18' x 36'
- Free standing new restroom building to service playground and pavilion
- · Free standing new concession building
- Relocated, fenced playground 2,300 sf
- Relocated, accessible 12' emergency vehicle route / pedestrian path
- Single tennis court / 2 pickle ball courts
- Basketball court full-sized 94' X 50'
- Ball kicking wall
- Accessible 900 sf concession patio with picnic area and tables

In meeting the objective to provide expanded recreation opportunities, the updated master site plan has these new facilities:

- Outdoor and indoor tennis/pickle ball facilities
- An accessible perimeter walking loop around the athletic fields
- Nature walking trail by the conservation pond
- Bicycle pump track area

Facility improvements and expanded outdoor and indoor recreation offerings provide opportunities to the Town to generate rental revenue.

In determining the feasibility of landscape improvements to the site the following design parameters were used:

- Parking spaces 9'x18'
- Isles 22' wide
- Paved sidewalks 5' wide
- Walking loop trail 4'-5' wide gravel or stone dust depending on accessibility need

NEXT STEPS

A planning-level estimate of probable construction costs has been developed for the recreation master site plan. The descriptive cost estimate document is provided in the appendix of this report.

The master site plan presented here is conceptual. Additional architectural, engineering, and landscape architectural design services are needed to further develop this plan are shown for in the project cost estimate.

In practical terms, a recreation facility improvement project would need to be phased so that activities could be continued at 55 Recreation Road while construction is underway. A precise strategy for phasing of implementation would be an objective of the next phase of project engineering and planning. That strategy would likely include constructing the building additions first, so that the existing buildings adjacent to the little league could be used until the new facilities were prepared and ready. Demolition of the existing recreation outbuildings and inadequate staff office trailer would proceed construction of the improvements planned for the central location between the two athletic fields.

Municipalities use varied methods to raise funds for public projects such as the expansion of recreation facilities:

- Issue a bond to raise funds that will be paid back over many years
- Plan capital improvements within annual budgets over time
- Raise funds from private local sources

In addition, there are varied grant opportunities for recreation facilities available to towns and cities that qualify.




Q1 What age range are you in?








Q3 How frequently do you use the facilities at 55 Recreation Road?


Q4 How do you primarily use the facility?







Q5 Do you most often arrive by car and park?





Q6 Do you most often drop off family members and return later for pick up?






Q8 Do you typically bring your own seating when you come?

Q9 What activities do you and/or your family use the recreation area for? Choose all that apply.




Q10 Are there any other activities, amenities, or improvements that you would like to see at the Rye Recreation Area? Choose all that apply.







Q11 What sports and activities would you like to see programming for within a new recreation center building at the Rye Recreation Area? Please select the ones you and/or your family would most enjoy.




